Waitematā Station Plaza and Tyler Street upgrade

The Tyler Street upgrade is nearly complete, with large areas of paving finished and new streetlights installed. You'll soon start to see fences coming down and newly paved areas opening up.

A path will be available on the northern side, near the shops, for people walking.

Meanwhile, progress continues at Waitematā Station Plaza. Drainage is now in place and more concrete has been poured.



What's coming up

- **Final touches on Tyler Street** - The new streetlights will be powered up, and the paving will be cleaned and sealed.
- **Continued work on Waitematā Station Plaza** - The sky lid, a key feature of the plaza, will start to take shape. Concrete pouring will continue, and paving is set to begin this week.
