


## 25 CAPILRE NORTHCOTE TOWN CENTRE

This year, we asked a group of Northcote Intermediate School students to get involved and use their creativity to show the town centre through their eyes.


Working alongside a professional photographer, Jinki Cambronero, this was a learning opportunity for students to think about their community and what it means to them.





















Tell us about your experience with this project.


Has this helped you to see things differently? Has it changed anything for you? Maybe how you look at nature?




"The water droplets on the plants looked really cool, reflecting against the green."



























"I noticed the clock. I never noticed that before.


"In the future there's gonna be a lot of new buildings. This place might be even turned into a city, so I'm excited, because now instead of a city, it's a nice town center with cool nature."
