Working with local students




A series of questions were posed to the students to spark discussion and ideas.

Questions

- Q. What would you like to do at the new community hub, both inside and outside?
- Q. How should the new community hub look and feel?
- Q. What would you like to see there?
- Q. How will you know you are in Northcote?
- Q. What would you like the play area to have?

Regenerating Northcote with help from local Students

It was fun gathering feedback from the students on Northcote's new community hub and neighbouring Puāwai Cadness Reserve. Our team worked with the students and their input into the design was crucial as they will be the future users of the space.

From the feedback session, some of the key points included:

What was loved

- The vibe in general it feels relaxing and like a nice space to go.
- Loved they were being involved in the process and were able to input ideas and feedback.
- Liked that the two playgrounds were separate because this would keep kids apart and stop them bumping into each other.

Big hits

- The hamster wheel, trampolines, swing off the tree, climbing and balance activites, the colour and brightness, and the greenery.
- Liked the field to be able to play games although they would also like some football goals.

What's missing

- Pump track or some kind of skate park but students agreed there were already a few in the area and at other schools.
- **Big kids playground** normal swings, a tall/big slide, climbing wall, but students agreed there was a lot of climbing areas already.
- Little kids springy horses because they are really fun!

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Town Centre

Northcote - It's coming together.


The regeneration of Northcote is well underway, with more exciting developments planned:

- The redevelopment of the town centre Northcote Central. There will be new shops, eateries, offices, homes, laneways, and a new town square, while retaining Northcote's unique character and celebrating its Asian, Māori, Pacific and European communities.
- A new community hub (on the Northcote Library site) and an upgrade of Puāwai Cadness Reserve.
- The extension of Ernie Mays Street, in stages, to Lake Road, to become the main street in the town centre and public transport hub.
- The completion of Te Ara Awataha Northcote's new greenway by extending it around the town centre.

New community hub and upgrade of Puāwai Cadness Reserve

A new community hub (combining the library and other community services in one building) is planned for the Northcote Library site, incorporating the current heritage-listed building. Puāwai Cadness Reserve, at the back of the library, will also be significantly upgraded and integrated more with the hub.

The vision for the community hub is to build a vibrant, welcoming place where the community can come together to connect, participate, and share experiences.

The designs have been developed with the help of a Community Needs Assessment (2021), library staff, and the other community providers, Auckland Council, mana whenua, Kaipātiki Local Board and Auckland Council's Healthy Waters.

Construction is expected to start in mid-late 2025 and take two years to complete. In early-mid 2025, the library will temporarily move to a hall at 1 Ernie Mays Street. NorthArt, Hearts & Minds, Plunket and the Citizens Advice Bureau will join the library in the hall, to create a temporary community hub for the duration of construction.
